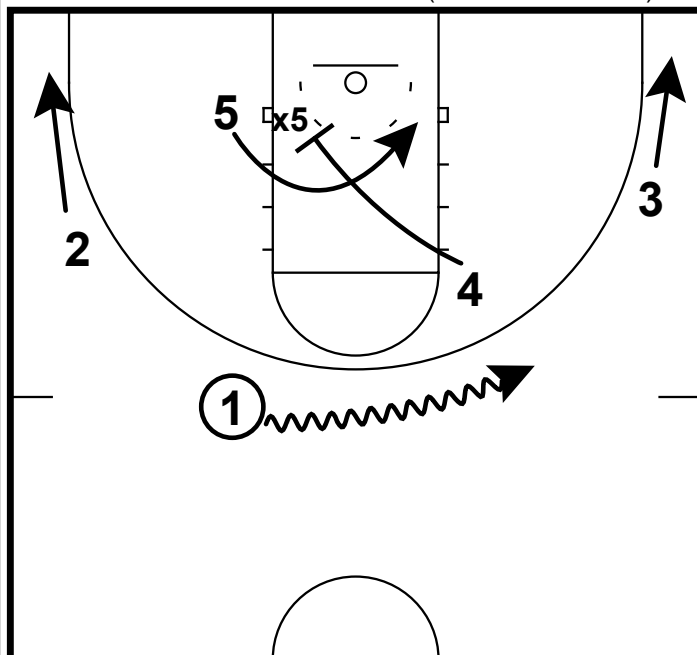
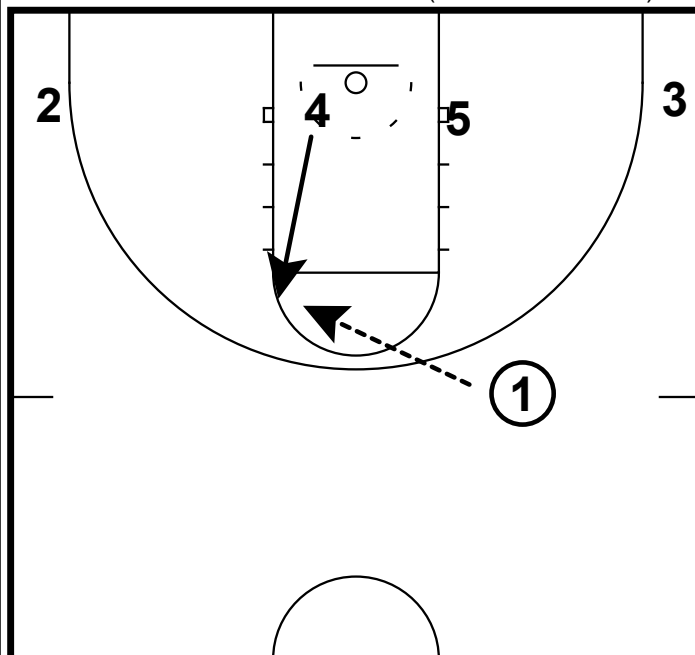


HALFCOURT: 4 PLAYER ISO (ERIC HAMILTON)



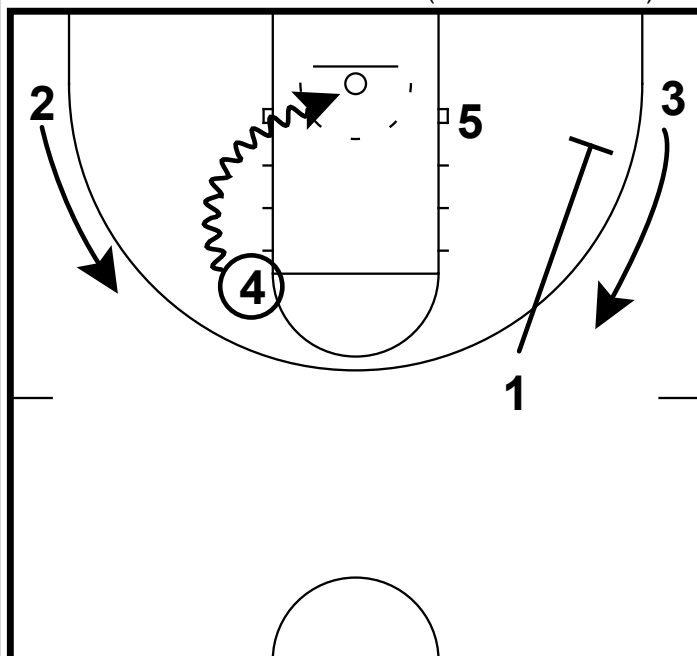
- 1) Eric Hamilton has developed into one of the more versatile forwards around the state of Georgia. He is a player that can score the ball inside or outside of the paint.
- 2) In this set, we start the ball on the strong side post. We would put Hamilton in the 4 spot. You could start the 4 player at the elbow or at the top of the key.
- 3) As the ball is dribble towards the 4 player, he will go and screen for 5 creating a curl cut situation.

HALFCOURT: 4 PLAYER ISO (ERIC HAMILTON)



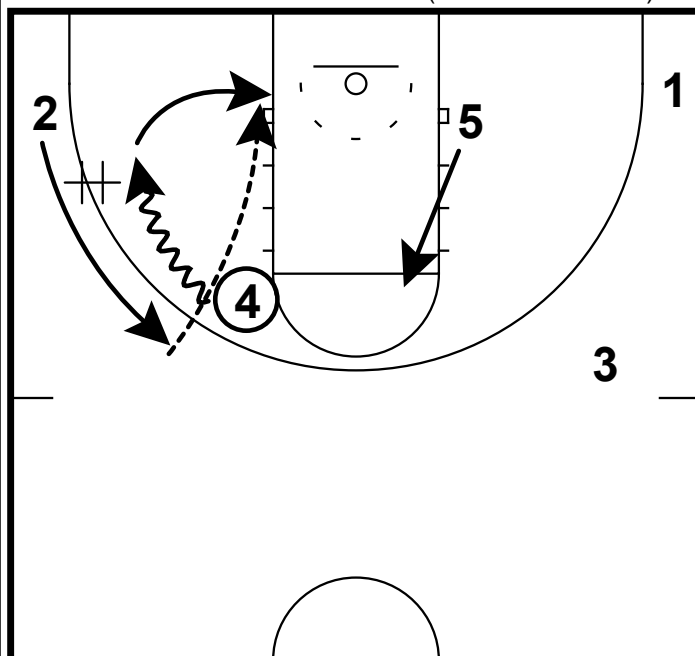
- 1) In this frame we show the 4 player making a "2nd cut" to the elbow area to create space.
- 2) If x4 has over-helped into a double team situation, 4 may be open at the mouth of the basket for an easy dunk.
- 3) However, it is more likely that the defense is paying more attention Hamilton in the situation and may have even switched.

HALFCOURT: 4 PLAYER ISO (ERIC HAMILTON)



- 1) If a switch has occurred it is probably a favorable match-up. The 4 player is free to create a shot on his own now.
- 2) A step out jumper would be good here, especially if a slower post is on the 4 player.
- 3) Coaching Point: Notice the movement of the other players around the arc. On penetration situations you need to teach your players to move to create gaps in the defense.

HALFCOURT: 4 PLAYER ISO (ERIC HAMILTON)



- 1) If the defense has played the first action well - this is a great opportunity for a two man game situation on the side.
- 2) A player like Hamilton would be able to handle the ball and create a dribble hand-off action and then roll quickly to the rim.
- 3) Notice how the opposite post player spaces up the lane to create room for the rolling 4 man to the rim.
