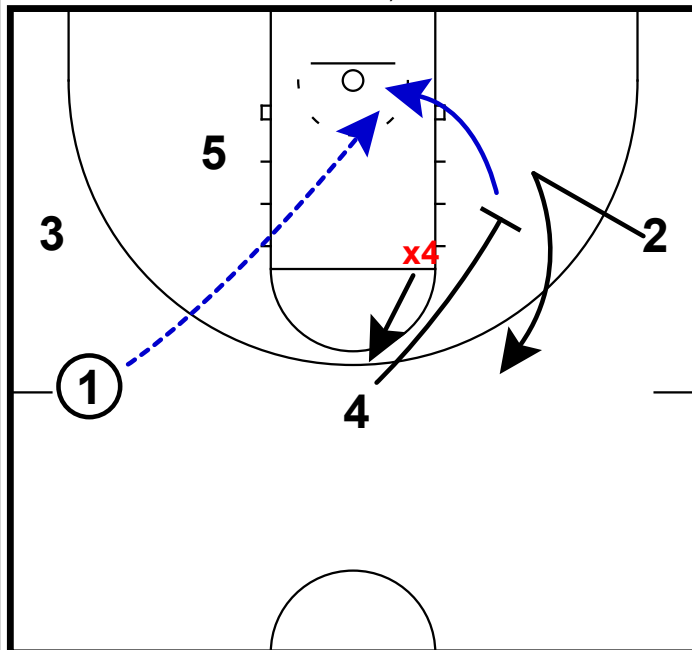
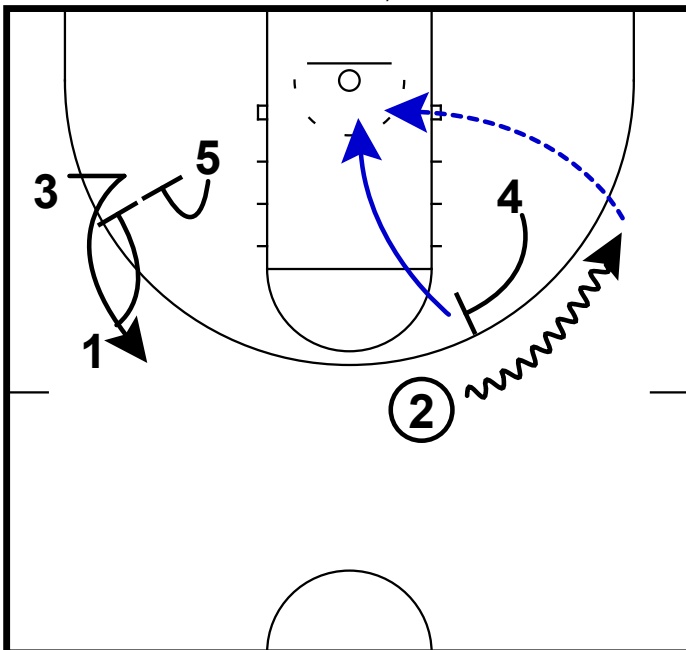


SECONDARY: 4 MAN TWO MAN GAME (SHAWNTREZ DAVIS)



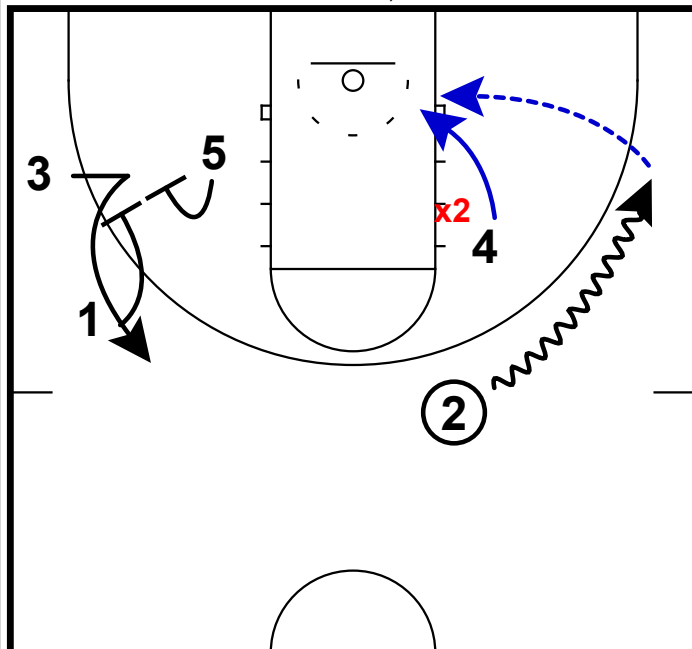
- 1) In a break situation, letting your 4 player screen away from the ball is a good way to open up the middle of the floor.
- 2) A player like **Shawntrez Davis** can really open up the options for a team in a secondary look.
- 3) Here we let davis screen away from the ball. If his man, **x4**, cheats up on the shooter on the down screen - Davis is athletic enough to slip quickly to the rim for an alley-oop situation.

SECONDARY: 4 MAN TWO MAN GAME (SHAWNTREZ DAVIS)



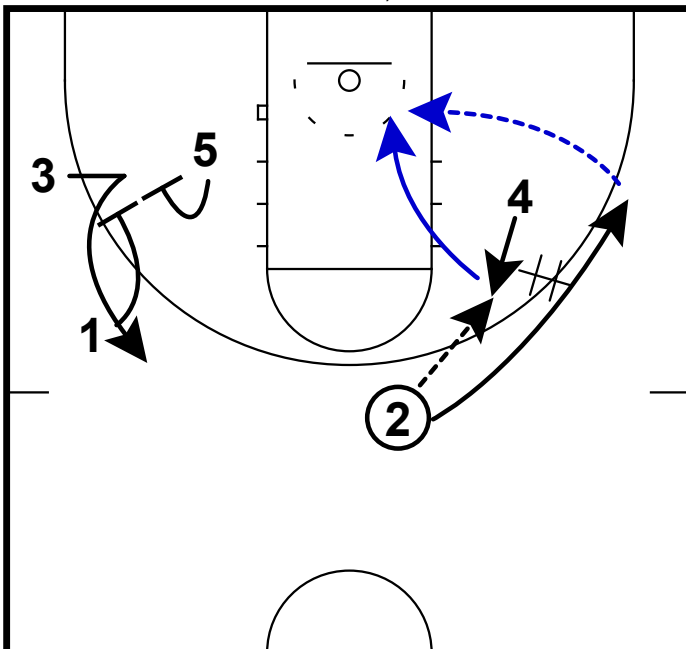
- 1) In this frame we look at a two-man game situation that could occur if the ball is reversed to 2 at the top of the key.
- 2) We would want our 4 player (**Davis**) to set an immediate ball screen on the ball.
- 3) Notice the action away from the ball: 5 & 1 should come together set a side by side double for 3 to open the roll for 4 in the middle of the floor.

SECONDARY: 4 MAN TWO MAN GAME (SHAWNTREZ DAVIS)



- 1) In this frame we look at what should happen if a switch occurs. A ball screen is not optimal, because more than likely the defense will simply switch back.
- 2) A versatile player like Davis can take a smaller player and post his defender up on the block.

SECONDARY: 4 MAN TWO MAN GAME (SHAWNTREZ DAVIS)



- 1) A final option in our 2 man game look here is a dribble hand-off option.
- 2) 4 needs to cut hard back to the ball and receive a pass around the arc area.
- 3) Once the pass is thrown from 2 to 4, 2 should cut hard off the top shoulder and get a quick handoff. This will create confusion and again your athletic 4 player is free to roll hard to the hoop.
